A message from the Mayor – Community Development Block Grant Funding (CDBG)

The 2020 budget for the City of Commerce City was recently supplemented by \$428,484 grant received through the Community Development Block Grant program. Commerce City receives this funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for community projects that benefit low-to-moderate income residents. The target area for these funds within the city is south of E. 96th Avenue. The CDBG program aims to provide decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities for Commerce City residents.

The information below explains the various funding opportunities already available through this program:

Home Repairs for Homeowners

Home repairs can be pricey. The good news is income-qualified Commerce City homeowners may be eligible for one or more Home Repair Programs (HRPs), as part of the city's CDBG program. Currently, there are three HRPs available for homeowners:

- Minor Home Repair Program minor home repairs (up to \$7,500 per household)
- **Weatherization Program** furnace and hot water heater improvements
- Paint-a-Thon Program exterior painting for seniors and disabled homeowners

The City will accept applications year-round until the funding is completely utilized. Home repair projects are approved on a first-come, first-served basis.

Public Service Programs

New this year, the CDBG program partnered with the Audio Information Network (AIN) to assist incomequalified city residents who are blind and/or reading impaired. Installed audio devices, such as an Amazon Echo with Alexa, will provide news, health and wellness, entertainment, and education in both English and Spanish. AINC offers in-home set up of equipment, training to use devices, and helps listeners obtain discounted internet services.

Non-profit Grant Funding

CDBG funding is available for non-profits, community and faith-based organizations, businesses, and city departments. All are encouraged to apply. CDBG can fund activities/projects for low-to-moderate-income residents such as: neighborhood improvements, transportation, senior services, youth services, crime prevention, housing counseling, homelessness prevention, medical and dental services, victim assistance, fitness promotion, and many more. Applications are due on March 11, 2020 by 11:59 pm MST.

The city needs public input on how to spend future funding and public participation is encouraged. The next Public Input Meeting to plan future CDBG projects will be held at the Eagle Pointe Recreation Center, 6060 E. Pkwy. Dr. on March 31, 2020, at 6:00 p.m.

Video and Audio in City Council Chambers

Staff recently received complaints about the quality of the video and audio when broadcasting City Council meetings. As a result, staff is looking at ways to increase the broadcast audio level during City Council meetings. All City Council meetings are broadcast live on the City website for anyone to view and on Comcast Channel 8 & 881 for local Commerce City residents with a Comcast cable subscription. Channel 8 is the Standard Definition (SD) broadcast and channel 881 is the High Definition (HD) broadcast. The preferred cable channel to tune into a City Council meeting is channel 881 as the video will look much better, provided the cable subscriber has an HD cable box and an HD TV. Finally, city staff are currently working with the vendor that manages the online streaming of City Council meetings on ways to improve the audio and video quality, when viewing meetings on-line.

Civic Academy

Commerce City conducted a pilot program of the Civic Academy last year. The seven-week program gives residents a chance to deepen their knowledge of the city and its operations, and is designed to develop and cultivate leaders in the community by informing residents, increasing engagement, improving trust, and encouraging residents to participate in the community. Council directed staff to continue the program in perpetuity based on the results of the pilot program. This year's Civic Academy will begin April 1 and run through May 13, with a graduation at the May 18 Council meeting. Applications are currently open to the public through the city website at c3gov.com/academy and are due by March 9. Enrollment is capped at 25 participants, who must be residents of Commerce City or employed at a business with a physical presence in Commerce City. Executive Summary:

This weekly update is intended to provide an overview of recent applications that have been submitted to the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC) or City applications within Commerce City boundaries.

General Updates

The city has launched a new <u>interactive online mapping tool</u> to display information on city permit activity. The map displays city application activity only – to access state permit information, including the location of any Form 2, Form 2a or Spacing applications, please visit the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC) mapping system <u>here</u>. Condor Well Site:

On October 17th, the permit application for the Condor well site was deemed complete by the city. Upon further review of the permit, it was discovered that the application was not notarized and signed by the landowner. Per section 21-3150 of the Land Development Code, an application must either be submitted by the property owner or a duly authorized agent. The previous application status given was done so in error, and the application submittal has been deemed **not complete.** A discrepancy has been noted in the location of the Oil and Gas Permit submittal, versus the location generally contemplated under the land owner's current PUD (Planned Unit Development) Zone Document application (Z-953-20). Once the necessary application materials needed to demonstrate owner's consent of the application is received, the application status will be appropriately reflected, and the application will continue being processed.

The table below shows the date each permit was submitted to the city, the date the permit application was deemed complete per section 5.2 of the Regional Operator Agreement, and the review status for each permit. Upon being referred out to a number of internal and external review entities, the permit undergoes an initial six-week review cycle, and is then scheduled for an internal Development Review Team (DRT) meeting. A comment letter is then issued to the applicant, informing them of revisions that need to be



made to the permit in order to continue the review process. For permits in the table above that require council action prior to approval, no final action will be taken on an administrative Oil and Gas Permit until council either approves, approves with conditions, or denies the relevant case. This table will be continuously updated as permits are under review by the city.
